I am going to the Autism Nature Trail to see a play.

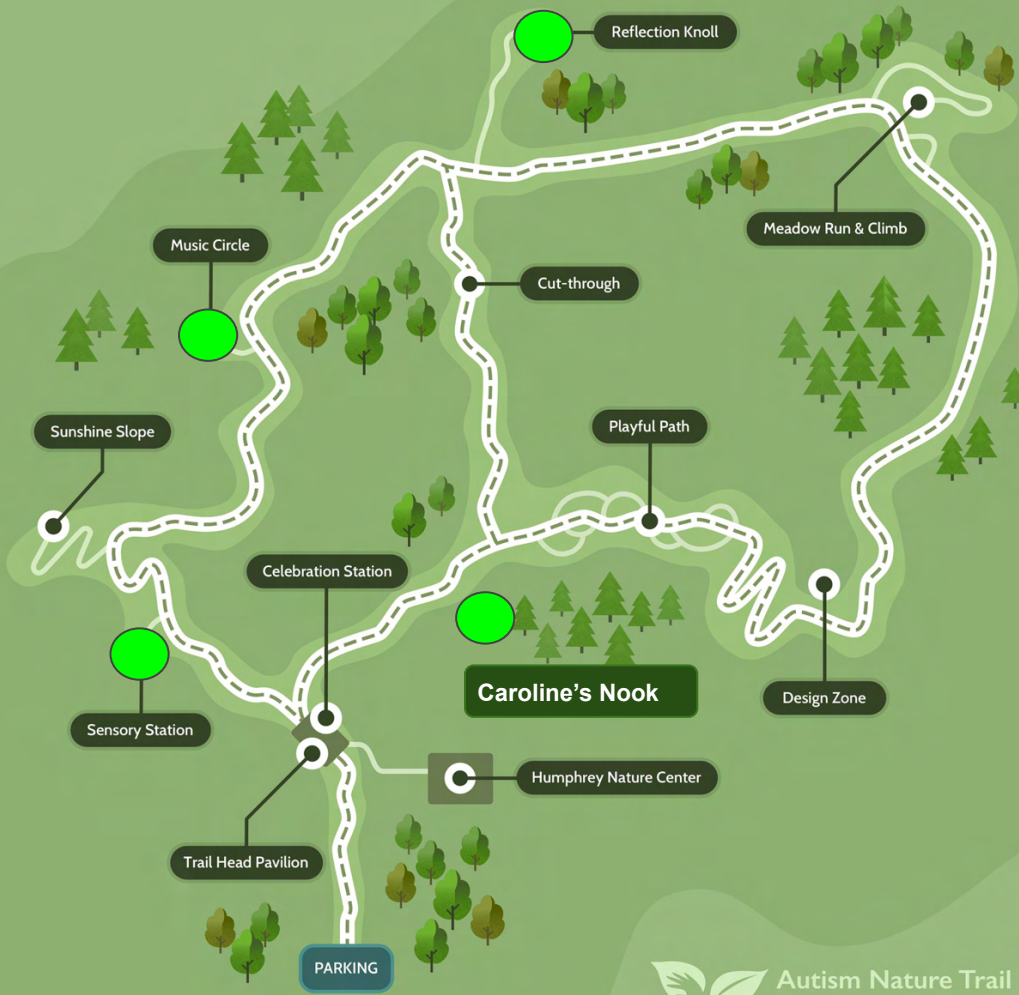
This play is titled

This show will include activities such as walking, singing, dancing and digging!

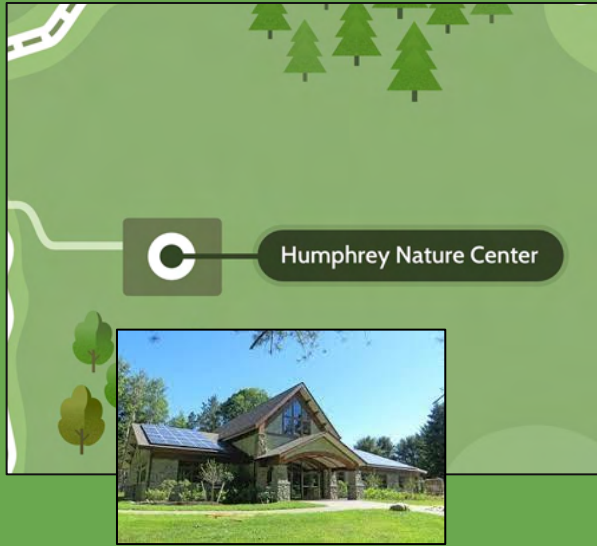
If I feel tired at any point, I can take a break or head back to the trailhead.

It's also a good idea to bring water and good clothes for hiking!



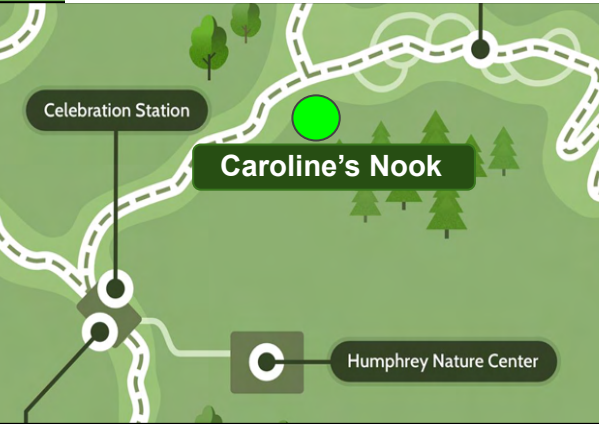
Because we are outside, we should check the weather to see what the best clothing would be. And if we want to sit, we should bring a blanket that can get a little dirty.

There will be Forest Friends to help us check in.



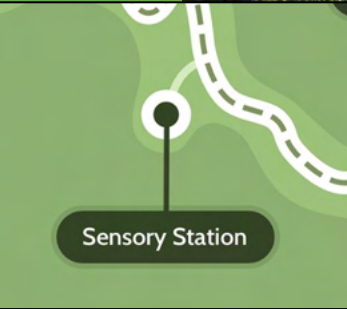
I can make a party crown, relax, play with some toys, and prepare for the show here.

Ms. Branch, the Forest Delivery Person, will appear to help, too!



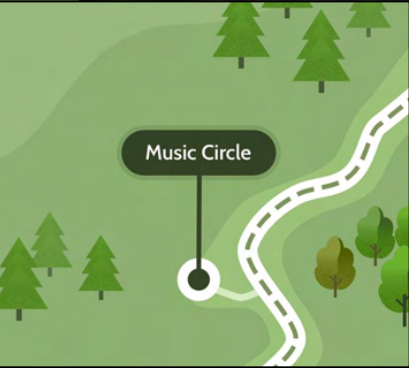
She will guide The Bear, The Beekeeper, and the audience in planning the party.

The Long Lost Nest at the Music Circle.



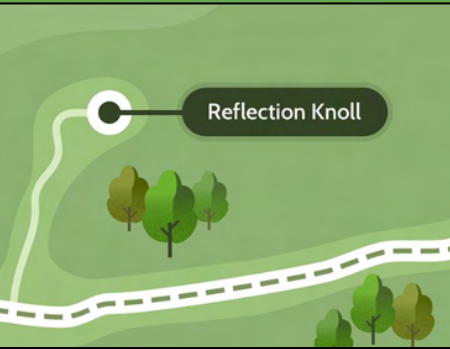
It is a short walk away from Sensory Station, and has
